
Introduction

The existence of informal economy and informal employment has been identified by the European Commission and other international and local agencies (OECD, ILO etc.) as a major barrier to enabling economic prosperity in Albania. ESAP-RCC has recently produced a diagnostic report for Albania that looks at drivers of undeclared work, the institutional framework and current policy approaches. The Albanian government has been taking courageous measures to reduce the informal economy and particularly the informal employment. On one hand, fundamental reforms to improving the business environment were initiated. On the other hand, the General Taxation Directorate started the implementation of an ambitious action plan. The diagnostic report reveals that informal economy in Albania is being tackled to some extent by fighting tax evasion and promoting tax compliance, but both informal economy and informal employment are not being addressed in a holistic manner. This is pointed out too, in the latest European Commission report for Albania (EC, 2018). Hence, fundamental efforts should be paid to building a holistic strategic approach to tackling informality. In this regard, the diagnosis report is complemented by a list of key recommendations on tackling undeclared work prepared by the ESAP-RCC experts.

Objectives

The workshop will provide policy-makers, employer and employees' organizations, economic experts, researchers and other actors with an opportunity to learn more about the results of an expert analysis of the informal economy and employment in Albania and recommendations for tackling informality from a holistic perspective. It will also encourage an open discussion among relevant actors in Albania on issues related to informal employment such as: What is the nature of informal employment in Albania? What are the barriers to formalization? What are the measures the Albanian government has undertaken to tackle informal employment and what are the results so far? What are the next steps the Albanian government, in collaboration with other key stakeholders, should undertake to tackle the informal employment into a more coordinated and holistic approach?

Inspired by the work of the European Platform Tackling Undeclared Work, this workshop is the first step towards the goal of supporting Western Balkan economies in effectively tackling undeclared work through a holistic approach, while at the same time establishing a strong base for exchange of good practices and mutual learning among peer institutions in the region.
